ROSCREA Voluntary Tidy Towns Committee

have achieved so much over the years and this year. Many say when you are actually doing any of the work, you are not really thinking of being recognised or rewarded! You do it because you feel it needs to be done. Tidy Towns is a voluntary group where individual members give of their time regularly, when they can. Volunteers turn up on a Saturday morning during the "Season" and/or Wednesday evening (in Summertime).

Tidy Towns works in conjunction with the great workers from our Community Employment Scheme who work day on day litter-picking, weed control, painting and maintenance. This year they painted all the railings on the Mall, the by-pass bridge, Burgoo Bridge, the railings on Convent Hill, Golden Grove/ Railway View as well as the Art Sculptures throughout the town. The Community Employment Scheme workers are owed a great debt of gratitude as without their help and skills these jobs would not get done in so short a period of time, if at all. Of the total of 47 entries in our Category, ROSCREA was placed in the top 20 placings with the 13th highest score! ROSCREA is in the same group as some well-known competition winners in the past!

The adjudicator was very complementary of the entry received from ROSCREA. "We would urge all business and residential premises to consider having any planned painting and upgrading done before next years competition judging as they would then be included in the adjudication and be of great benefit to the town".

On Friday October 28th the Award Ceremonies were attended at the RDS in Dublin. ROSCREA Tidy Towns have been entering the competition for more than 40 years and are delighted to have retained their bronze medal for another year. Imagine our delight in 2017 when we were awarded a Silver Medal! We have been awarded a bronze medal in every year since.

In past years our Community Employment Scheme Workers have done Trojan work in the area of litter control, collecting on average 250kg of litter per month. We ask all to please bring your litter home, to reduce, reuse and recycle please.

A small group of voluntary volunteers cannot do everything that needs to be remedied. But, it takes a cooperative effort between public officials and agencies, clubs, businesses, residents associations and individuals together with Tidy Towns to progress our town and earn greater awards on a national platform. Community work together to care more for our Environment and have our town on the map as a National Winner!
