THE ROOSTER

High-flying protection

In 1860, Notre-Dame de Paris was crowned with a copper cockerel. Damaged in the fire it was replaced by a new rooster designed by Phillippe Villeneuve, chief architect of *Monuments Historiques*, as well as a cross and crown restored according to the design by Viollet-le-Duc. The cockerel was blessed by Laurent Ulrich, Archbishop of Paris, who replaced the relics housed in the spire and added a parchment with the names of 2,000 companions who raised Notre-Dame de Paris from the ashes.

The tradition of putting roosters on bell towers dates back to the Middle Ages in Europe. In the 9th century Pope Leo IV was the first to install one on St. Peter's Basilica in Rome.

Crowing at dawn, the rooster symbolises the transition from darkness to light.

At the top of churches, it represents the vigilance of Christians awaiting the resurrection.

The rooster contains relics of Saint Genevieve, Saint Denis and a fragment of Christ's Crown of Thorns. The Lord and two Parisian saints therefore watch over Paris' Cathedral and its people.

As France's national symbol, the rooster at the top of the spire reaffirms the Cathedral' Central place in the history of France.
